- Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance on November 20th that honors the memory of those whose lives were lost in acts of anti-transgender violence.

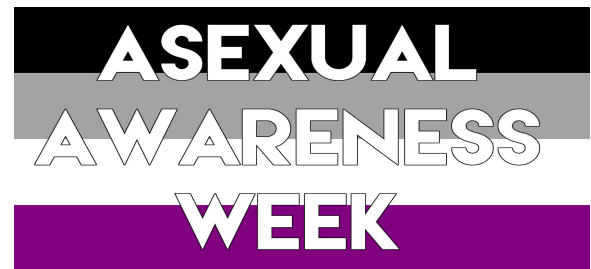


## No Name Calling Week
